
#### New Freshman Applications, Acceptances and Enrollment Fall 2011 - Fall 2017




#### Transfer Applications, Acceptances and Enrollment Fall 2011 - Fall 2017




#### New Freshman Completed Applications and Enrollment by Gender\* Fall 2011 - Fall 2017

#### Notes:

- 1. Freshmen who enter the University in the fall or preceding summer term are counted as "new freshmen." Similarly, transfer students entering in the fall or preceding summer term are counted as "transfer students" for the fall semester.
- 2. "Transfer students" refers to the entering summer/fall group of transfer students. For example, in Fall 2011 the 449 entering transfer students comprised 3.6% of the 12,575 undergraduates. However, for Fall 2011 the total number of enrolled undergraduates who had transferred into the University consisted of (a) transfers who entered in Fall 2011 and (b) students who transferred into the University in previous academic years. Generally, the total enrollment of students who had entered as transfer students is approximately 15% of the undergraduate student body.







<sup>\*</sup> In 2010, in order to fulfill new federal government reporting requirements on race and ethnicity, students were given the opportunity to select multiple race categories. In addition, Pacific Islander was designated as its own category (separate from Asian). The students were asked two questions. The first question asked the student "Are you Hispanic/Latino?" The second question allowed students to select among five race categories, with multiple responses allowed.







#### Students From Texas by County Fall 2017





#### Headcount Enrollment Percentage by Unit Fall 2011 - Fall 2017












# Average Compensation of Full-Time Instructional Faculty on Academic Year Contracts 2011-12 through 2017-18

### Tuition, Room and Board Charges 2011-12 through 2017-18










