
New Freshman Applications, Acceptances and Enrollment Fall 2012 - Fall 2018




Transfer Applications, Acceptances and Enrollment Fall 2012 - Fall 2018




New Freshman Completed Applications and Enrollment by Gender* Fall 2012 - Fall 2018

Notes:

- 1. Freshmen who enter the University in the fall or preceding summer term are counted as "new freshmen." Similarly, transfer students entering in the fall or preceding summer term are counted as "transfer students" for the fall semester.
- 2. "Transfer students" refers to the entering summer/fall group of transfer students. For example, in Fall 2018 the 352 entering transfer students comprised 2.5% of the 14,188 ernolled undergraduates. However, for Fall 2018 the total number of enrolled undergraduates who had transferred into the University consisted of (a) new transfers who entered in Fall 2018 and (b) students who transferred into the University in previous academic years. Generally, the total enrollment of students who had entered as transfer students is approximately 10-15% of the undergraduate student body.







Enrollment Fall 2012 - Fall 2018









^{*} In 2010, in order to fulfill new federal government reporting requirements on race and ethnicity, students were given the opportunity to select multiple race categories. In addition, Pacific Islander was designated as its own category (separate from Asian). The students were asked two questions. The first question asked the student "Are you Hispanic/Latino?" The second question allowed students to select among five race categories, with multiple responses allowed.


In this table, students are counted in only one race/ethnic group category. If the student indicated "yes" to the first question, the student was categorized as Hispanic (only) regardless of any race code(s) they may have selected. If the student marked more than one race (and "no" to Hispanic/Latino in the first question), he/she was reported in the category of Multiracial.







Students From Texas by County Fall 2018





Headcount Enrollment Percentage by Unit Fall 2012 - Fall 2018















Average Compensation of Full-Time Instructional Faculty on Academic Year Contracts 2011-12 through 2017-18

Tuition, Room and Board Charges 2012-13 through 2018-19










